
## **CHORD FORMATION - using C as example**

Chord formation starts with the basic major form.

This consists of the triad - three notes of the scale - the 1st - 3rd - and 5th degrees of the scale



We use this as a basic building block for chords

i.e

Major = 135 C

Minor = 1 b 3 5 Cm

Major  $6th = 1 \ 3 \ 5 \ 6 \ C6$ 

Major 7th = 1357 Cmaj7 - C $\triangle$ 

Augmented = 1 3 #5 C+ - C#5

Diminished = 1 b3 b5 6 Cdim - Co7

Dom 7th = 1 3 5 b7 **C7** 

Minor 6th = 1 b3 5 6 Cm6

Minor 7th = 1 b3 5 b7 Cm7

Dom 9th =  $1 \ 3 \ 5 \ b7 \ 9$  **C9** 

Dom 11th = 1 3 5 b7 9 11 C11

Dom  $13th = 1 \ 3 \ 5 \ b7 \ 9 \ 13 \ C13$ 

all extensions build on b7 i.e C7 = C E G Bb C9 = C E G Bb D

To play altered chords - follow chord symbol

Cm7b5 = Cm7-5
